From the Superintendent's desk...

Dear Joliet School Community,

We have persevered and thrived through an extraordinary school year. Joliet teachers and staff rose to the challenge and performed in ways we never thought we would have to perform. Parents supported us more than ever by becoming co-teachers at home while supporting Joliet students in their educational pursuits. It was tumultuous at times, but together we made it. Thank you for all of your contributions and support, and for the remarkable level of hard work needed to make it through the year.

To highlight some changes, we celebrated multiple retirements and added a 4-year old kinder program in the District. As a result, we welcome Jill Brookings as the new K-12 District Secretary, Kaleb Price as an HS English teacher, Kristen Goodwin as high school special education teacher, Anna Kilebrew as K-12 art teacher, and Kendall Denham, Emily Fanus and Eleah Wend as elementary teachers.

Other noticeable changes include the renovation of four elementary bathrooms, increased safety measures in the science lab and high school shop, a new phone system throughout the school and the roof replacement over the elementary and multi-purpose room. Likewise, there was a transition from 16 analog cameras to 45 digital cameras for surveillance purposes. The new framework allows clear viewing and easy retrieval as the Joliet School Administrators use the cameras to deter and reduce theft, loss and vandalism. It can also aid the efforts of law enforcement in the event of threats on campus. Other expansive safety measures include the purchase of Reflex Protect for all classrooms and most offices.

We also made technology infrastructure improvements, which are in alignment with the five-year technology plan. Many classrooms have brand new SMART Boards, and many teachers and students have new laptops or Chromebooks. The technology levy has helped the District keep up with technological needs as the digital world evolves. In addition to the tech levy being in its final year, the 17 year old bond passed in 2003 for the gym addition was fully matured on June 30th, 2020. Debt service payments from the District are no longer required, which is a huge financial relief for tax payers.

Multiple dialogues have transpired with various entities as we continue to prepare for the reopening of school on August 27th. As part of the preparation, we created a task force composed of 17 community members to devise a plan. Ultimately, the plan is the work of the board of trustees, administrative team, employees, parents, students, state and local health officials, and community members all collaborating to identify how instruction will be delivered to students; how gatherings and events will take place on school property if and when appropriate; how the health and safety of staff and students will be protected and preserved while schools are open; and how financial and operational functions of the school district will continue during this public health emergency. School leaders have considered all available options and perspectives to make decisions that reflect the circumstances in our community.

Parents can assist the District by remaining vigilant and sensible in the approach to dealing with COVID-19. Together we are the influence on our student's reactions to these types of events. Remaining calm, respectful, empathetic, and inclusive, while advocating for ourselves and others, is the ultimate goal as we move forward.

Despite the pandemic interruption to our lives, we still managed to do amazing things. Congratulations in particular to our seniors, the Class of 2020, and to our 8th graders who are moving to the next level. Kudos to those groups as they adjusted their expectations and continued to look for the "silver lining". Making profound emotional shifts takes a lot of courage and energy, and these students did so with finesse.

As always, we appreciate our community's support and cooperation, and we are looking forward to an interesting and fabulous year!

From Mr. Begger...

"We choose to go to the moon, and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard."
-John F. Kennedy, 1962

This past year, Joliet students celebrated the 50th anniversary of the moon landing and vowed to heed JFK's words of not shying away from challenges because they are hard.

I read books to students on the mission and we recited JFK's words throughout the year. Who knew that the school year would provide the greatest challenge to education any of us had ever seen. It was a hard year. But, I'm proud to say that our students, parents, and teachers did not shy away from the challenge presented by distance learning. Our students' response to the circumstances strengthened my belief in the Joliet community and revealed the strong sense of grit that defines us.

Even with the early closure, there remains great work being done. From a curricular standpoint, our K-5 team is now universally reporting grades in a standards based method. The method allows for greater specificity in communicating a student's area of academic achievement. Our K-3 team is using the same phonics program which is greatly impacting early literacy. Additionally, our K-4 teachers implemented the PAX Good Behavior Game classroom management strategies. The approach focuses on positive behavior supports, increases a student's ability to self-regulate & delay gratification, and is evidence based to prevent suicide ideation. For the 2020-2021 school year, all K-5 teachers have been trained and the District was selected as one of six schools in the state of Montana as a PAX Exemplar Grant School.

In the middle school, our 6th graders did a fantastic job of integrating into the junior high. 6th graders also piloted standards based grading in the middle school. We believe in this model of student feedback and we will push the standard based grading initiative forward with this group to 7th grade. As a result, the 2020-2021 school year will see standards based grading across grades K-7.

When it comes to the overall education environment, we are always looking to get better and we welcome an open dialogue with the community. Please feel free to give me a call anytime.

Undoubtedly, the upcoming year will be filled with challenges. I assure you, we will not shy away from them.

I look forward to seeing all of our students on campus and learning on August 27th.
